Anne Wexler Australian-American Public Policy Scholarships

Applications for scholarships in 2011 open | July – 30 September 2010

Two prestigious Anne Wexler Scholarships will be awarded annually. One for an Australian citizen to enrol in a U.S. Masters degree program in Public Policy, and one for a U.S. citizen to enrol in an Australian Masters program in Public Policy.

The aim of the Anne Wexler Scholarships is to grow Australian-American educational linkages by building the network of public policy experts and to encourage ongoing policy exchange between both countries. They enable Australian and U.S. postgraduate students with strong academic credentials and leadership potential to undertake a Master's degree in Australia or the United States in an area that supports the late Mrs Wexler's bi-national interests in the field of public policy. These may include key areas such as health, sustainability, energy, climate change, regional security, political science, history or governmental relations.

The scholarships will be awarded for a maximum two year period and be valued at up to A\$140,000 each. Consideration will be given to those undertaking one year of study to complete a Master's degree.

Benefits include:

- Annual stipend of up to A\$30,000 for a maximum of two years
- Tuition fees of up to A\$25,000 per year for a maximum of two years
- Travel allowance of A\$5,000 for return travel
- Establishment allowance of A\$6,000
- Insurance A\$4,000
