INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

Construction practice has a growing focus on sustainable construction. With an increase in demand for sustainable buildings, it is important to have strong management during the planning and implementation of sustainable building projects.

Duration: Minimum 3 semesters full-time; flexible part-time and intensive mode delivery available

Starting: January, May, September

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of any undergraduate degree, or qualifications and / or relevant professional experience deemed equivalent by the Institute's Director.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Construction Practice focuses on the organisation and management of project resources (people, process, products, energy, finance and space) to deliver building projects on time, within cost, and of the defined scope and quality.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE - 12 SUBJECTS

This program allows students to exit after one semester (4 subjects) with a Graduate Certificate, after two semesters (8 subjects) with a Postgraduate Diploma, or complete all three semesters (12 subjects) for a Master's degree.
